



When the Museum of Tolerance opened in 1993, Simon Wiesenthal told this story: "When we come to the other world and meet the millions of Jews who died in the camps and they ask us, 'What have you done?- there will be many answers. But I will have the privilege of saying to them, 'I have never forgotten you." Most of all, Simon never forgot Anne Frank. On his desk when he died, was the newspaper

article of the capture of the man who arrested her. Of the many Nazis he brought to justice he was most proud of finding the Nazi who arrested Anne Frank, because to him she best represented what the world lost by the murder of six million Jews.

When Anne Frank went into hiding in the attic on July 6, 1942, few people knew her name. June 12, 2019 would have been her 90th birthday and hundreds of millions all over the world now know her.

She was an extraordinary young lady. When she entered the secret annex she wrote, "I feel wicked sleeping in a warm bed while somewhere out there my dearest friends are dropping from exhaustion of being knocked to the ground."

"I don't want to have lived in vain ...I want to be useful of bringing enjoyment to all people, even those I've never met. I want to go on living even after my death."

We hope you enjoy the play, and return to visit the Anne exhibit.

This is not a simple history lesson. It is a resonant clarion call to open our eyes and see the world we live in, threatened by the tide of rising antisemitism, racism and intolerance.

Thank you for being here with us to bear witness to these events and to honor the memory of the fallen and celebrate the strength of the survivors.

It has had over 40 productions all over the world. Since then, he has written four original musicals: A Little More Alive (commissioned by Broadway Across America and produced at Williamstown Theatre Festival, Kansas City Rep and Barrington Stage before being optioned as a feature film); Soon (premiered at Signature Theatre, Stephen Sondheim Young Artist Citation); Fallout (with Kyle Jarrow); and Space Dogs (with Van Hughes and Tina Landau). Other writing projects include the film adaptation of the YA novel This Song Will Save Your Life (for Rent producer Kevin McCollum); three projects for Marvel/Disney, and a film for Universal Pictures. Nick has also released two pop albums, both available on iTunes and Spotify. As an actor, he most recently was nominated for a Drama Desk Award for his performance as Jonathan Larson in the Off-Broadway Revival of Tick, Tick...Boom!, and is currently playing Mendel in the First National Tour of Falsettos. SUZI DIETZ (Producer) has been producing theater in Los Angeles since 1979. In addition to presenting shows in a variety of venues over the years, Dietz also ran a number of theaters. She was the artistic director of the LA Stage Company, where she produced the long-running *Nuts* and Christopher Durang's *Sister Mary Explains it All for You*, the producing artistic director of the Pasadena Playhouse, where she produced *Mail*; and The Canon Theater, where she produced Caryl Churchill's award-winning *Cloud Nine* and the long-running Love Letters, among many others. In 2006, after the Canon was torn down, she turned her attention to the east, where she now produces both on and off-Broadway. She is the recipient of numerous awards such as a Drama-Logue Lifetime Achievement Award and five Tony nominations, including one for Suzan-Lori Parks' Pulitzer Prize-winning *TopDog Underdog* and another for *Fela!*, conceived and directed by Bill T. Jones. She is the Executive Producer of *Every Act of Life*, a documentary about Terrence McNally, which premiered at the TriBeCa Film Festival and can be seen on PBS' American Masters this summer, and Sam Harris' *Ham-A Musical Memoir* which will premiere at OutFest this Summer. She is currently producing Barra Grant's *Miss America's Ugly Daughter* at the Edgemar Center for the Arts.

EVE BRANDSTEIN (Director) has helmed the recent theatrical productions of Miss America's Ugly Daughter, at The Broad Stage, Rain Pyror's Fried Chicken & Latkes, which Eve will executive produce as a television series. She directed both the original production and the recent revival of Monica Piper's Not That Jewish. Also the off-Broadway productions of Shut Up, Sit Down & Eat, a hit that ran for two years, and Voices of Swords; the N.Y. and L.A. premieres of Revisiting Wildfire, Ronnie Spector's Beyond the Beehive, Waiting for Jack - A Beat Poetry Reunion, Claiming Allen Ginsberg and Suzanne Wang's Cracked Open. Headquartered in Los Angeles, the Simon Wiesenthal Center maintains offices in New York, Toronto, Miami, Chicago, Paris, Buenos Aires and Jerusalem.

The Campus Outreach division is active on university and college campuses that have been affected by anti-Semitism and BDS. Working with students and professionals, the Center creates programming, arranges speaker tours and events, and responds quickly when an incident erupts. The Wiesenthal Government Advocacy Internship Program educates the next generation of students to be effective Jewish leaders.

The Wiesenthal Center's three landmark exhibitions travel the globe and have been displayed in the Vatican, on Capitol Hill, at the UN and in cities throughout the world. They are People, Book, Book, Land: The 3,500 Year Relationship of the Jewish People With The Holy Land, The Birth of Israel: 18 Months that Changed Jewish Destiny and The Courage to Remember.

In a year where anti-Semitism showed disturbing signs of growth worldwide, the Center's annual *Digital Terrorism and Hate Project* and *Top Ten Worst Global Anti-Semitic Incidents* are more important than ever.

Moriah Films

The two-time Academy Award® winning film division of the Simon Wiesenthal Center has produced 16 documentaries on the epic events that have shaped modern Jewish history. Narrators for Moriah Films have included Elizabeth Taylor, Orson Welles, Sir Ben Kingsley, Michael Douglas, Dustin Hoffman, Nicole Kidman, Morgan Freeman, Christoph Waltz, Sandra Bullok and George Clooney. Museum of Tolerance Jerusalem

Museum of Tolerance



The Museum of Tolerance is the educational arm of the Simon Wiesenthal Center. dedicated to challenging visitors to confront bigotry and racism, and to understand the Holocaust in both historic and contemporary contexts.


Since opening in 1993, the Museum has hosted close to seven million visitors, including three million children and teens. Close to 200,000 people have been trained in the Museum's customized professional development programs.

Visitors have included 5 American Presidents, 6 Israeli Prime Ministers, numerous presidents from around the world, religious leaders including the Dalai Lama, and Nobel Laureates.

Holocaust survivors volunteer their time at the Museum up to four times a day to share their personal stories. Over 50,000 visitors a year meet and hear a Holocaust survivor who are the most effective ambassadors of memory, hope and tolerance.

No other institution offers such a motivational mix of historical discovery and personal empowerment, receiving the Global Peace and Tolerance Award from the Friends of the United Nations.





Anne is the Museum's newest exhibition and provides an extraordinary view of Anne Frank, narrated by Academy Award®-nominated actress Hailee Steinfeld. Anne brings Anne Frank's story to life through immersive environments, multimedia presentations and intriguing displays.

Anne's story is told in her own words, rare artifacts, unique documents, and photographs. Visitors view a reproduction of her famous diary and several other examples of her original writing that culminated in what has become one of the most famous and well-read books ever.

Also in the Museum of Tolerance is the recreation of famed Nazi hunter Simon Wiesenthal's Vienna office where, proudly displayed on Mr. Wiesenthal's desk, is the newspaper article detailing the arrest of Karl Silberbauer, the Nazi that arrested Anne Frank and who Mr. Wiesenthal brought to justice many years ago.
