Marissa Roth is a Pulitzer Prize winning photojournalist, documentary photographer and curator. *One Person Crying: Women and War,* her global project spanning 35 years of work, is a traveling exhibition. *Witness to Truth,* her portraits of Holocaust survivors, is on permanent exhibition at the Museum of Tolerance.

Margaret Traub, as Head of Global Initiatives for International Medical Corps and a member of the Emergency Response Team, travels extensively to field programs around the world – including to Syria, Lebanon, the Democratic Republic of Congo, South Sudan, and Haiti – to assist and to advocate for those affected by crisis.
