In partnership with the Los Angeles Superior Court, the Museum of Tolerance (MOT) provides a five-day juror training for SHADES, a specialized Teen Court, focusing on bullying incidents rooted in prejudice and bias. Jurors learn how to interpret hate incident and crime laws and to promote transformative healing outcomes.

The five-day summer program features interactive activities and workshops led by judges, lawyers, and professional human relations facilitators on understanding the forms and consequences of bias and hate, enhancing empathy, and developing interpersonal skills to serve as this specialized youth juror. The Institute also includes custom exhibit tours, arts-based expression, and special speakers sharing victim testimony as well as messages of hope and empowerment.
