

DIGITAL EMPOWERMENT WORKSHOP



For grades 8-12

Museum of Tolerance (MOT) is offering a new dynamic, classroom-based workshop that engages students in critical thinking for decoding and rejecting online hate. This is an online safety curriculum aligned with ISTE digital citizenship standards and based on foundational media literacy skills. Students will apply Center for Media Literacy's **5 Key Questions** to diverse real life examples compiled by the Simon Wiesenthal Center (SWC)'s Research Department. They are challenged to interpret the hateful messages and their impact. The workshop ends using an action planning worksheet which all students take home for ongoing use.

The workshop is 50 minutes and is delivered in your classroom by one of our trained facilitators.
